North Circular – quick update

This summer should see the council put forward rat-running proposals for local consultation – we will make sure that you have a chance to get involved in the decisions. We are concerned that the proposals will not be enough to reduce this very serious problem, and if necessary we will lobby for an increase in the £4m made available by TfL.

We proposed that some parts of the planned North Circular scheme, including widening Telford Road, improved lighting and road surfaces, closing the turn into Melville Gardens

LONDON GETS GREENER

Greens on the London Assembly have secured funding for a raft of Green measures following an agreement with Ken Livingstone.

The measures include:

-  a Green Home Advice Centre, to help people to install solar panels, wind
-  turbines and energy conservation measures;
-  £5 million extra funding for cycling;
-  £3.5 million for developing local food projects such as farmers markets;
-  support for people campaigning against a third runway at Heathrow.

In a public statement Ken Livingstone acknowledged, **“The contribution made by the Green Assembly Members’ proposals has been very significant in ... shaping my plans for next year and beyond.”**
