The Stark Reality

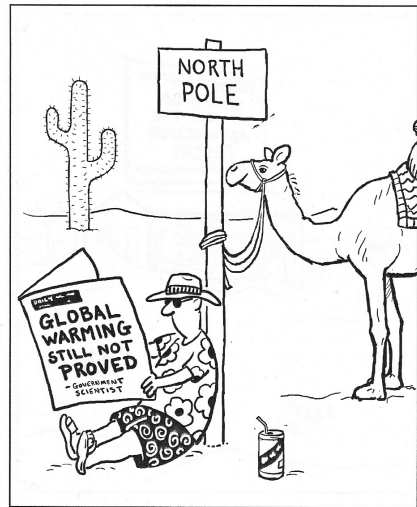
